The following information is taken from the DAVYS family records; -

1818. Aug. 24 - The first prisoner confined in the new Goal of Roscommon was OWEN CUMANE, of Ballymurray, Co. Rosc. He was confined in the old goal for Rioting several times, and when in confinement there he commenced great turbulence and mutiny by breaking a door and burning it and stirring up the other prisoners to mutiny. Application being made to me (Christopher Davys, of Grove & Martinstown.) by JOHN CARSON, under Sheriff, and JOSEPH HEILY(?), Governor of the goal, I committed him to solitary confinement in the new Goal. (Gaol was spelt Goal in the original document).
